

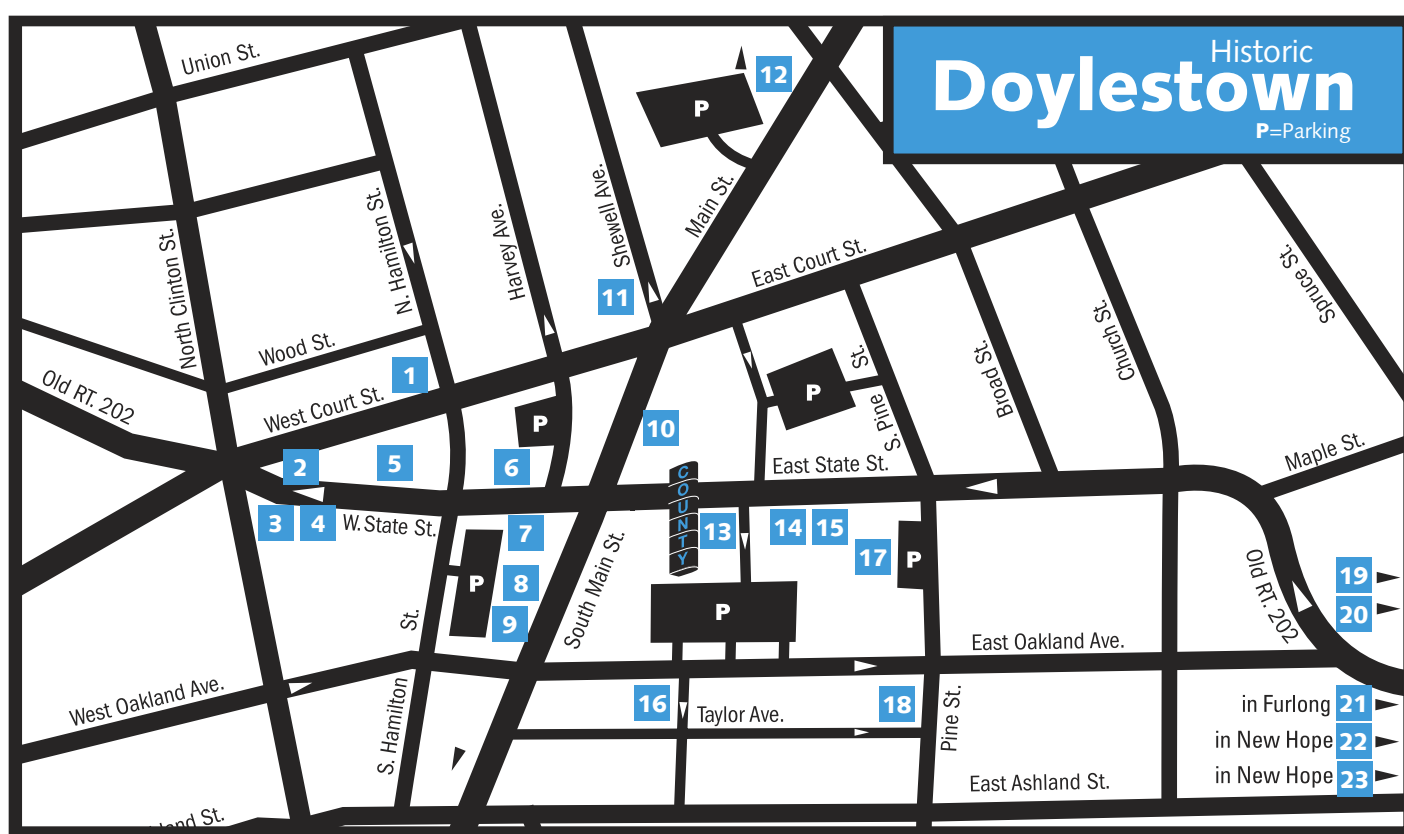

Millions

Great Britain, Danny Boyle, 1 hr 37 min
MILLIONS is a contemporary fairy tale about two young British brothers who stumble upon a bag filled with money. It's an affectionate comedy about family and life and morality. And the younger boy (played by Alex Etel) is an all-time scene stealer. Director Danny Boyle, who always adds an edge to the proceedings, accurately describes this eccentric and inventive film as "Trainspotting meets Amelie."



Vera Drake

Great Britain, Mike Leigh, 2 hr 5 min
Mike Leigh is at the peak of his powers with VERA DRAKE, a morally complex drama set in a vividly drawn post WWII London. This impeccably made film is about a middle-aged woman of relentless good cheer who serves others. She also helps young girls "in trouble", which soon runs her afoul of the law. The ensemble acting in this drama is as good as it gets.

Born Into Brothels

Great Britain/USA, Ross Kauffman & Zana Briski, 1 hr 25 min
A British photographer endeavors to help the children of Calcutta's red light district by teaching them how to use a camera. BORN is inspiring as well as unflinching in its realism.



In The Realms of the Unreal

USA, Jessica Yu, 1 hr 21 min
A fascinating examination of self-taught outsider artist Henry Darger. The reclusive janitor and dishwasher toiled in complete obscurity for 60 years. After his death, hundreds of amazing paintings and a 15,000 page fantasy-adventure novel were found in his apartment. Childlike, yet disturbing, Darger's art is truly haunting.



Gunner Palace

USA/Germany, Michael Tucker & Petra Epperlein, 1 hr 25 min
A portrait of the War in Iraq as seen by American soldiers in Baghdad. Without any political agenda, this film gets you on the ground, with the troops, for images and stories that you won't see on the evening news. It is frank, unfiltered, and real.

Bride and Prejudice

Great Britain, Gurinder Chadha, 1 hr 50 min
This immensely likeable comedy/romance from the director of *Bend It Like Beckham* is a Bollywood take on Jane Austen. Music, dance and spectacle collide with love, vanity, and social pressure, as a young Indian woman searches for a suitable husband. It's an over-the-top, Technicolor, feel-good movie.



Look at Me

France, Agnes Jaoui, 1 hr 51 min
with subtitles

The director of the marvelous *The Taste of Others* returns with this funny and satiric gem. It's about an egotistical writer and his overweight daughter who can't seem to please him. Beautifully paced with a light and humorous touch, LOOK AT ME deflates the pretensions and self-obsessions of the Parisian literati.



The Chorus

France, Christophe Barratier, 1hr, 37 min
with subtitles

A heartwarming tale about a music teacher who makes a difference in the lives of the boys of a reformatory. Set in small town France, circa 1949, the film is beautifully shot and highly evocative. And the boys' music itself, which is nicely integrated into the story, is purely sublime.



In My Country

Great Britain, John Boorman, 1 hr 43 min

A black American reporter is sent to South Africa to cover the Truth and Reconciliation Commission. He meets a white Afrikaans poet who is trying to confront the history of apartheid. It's a story that charts the depths of human cruelty and the power of forgiveness and love. Starring Samuel L. Jackson and Juliette Binoche.



Travellers and Magicians

Bhutan, Khientse Norbu, 1 hr 47 min
w/subtitles

Filmed in the Himalayan countryside of Bhutan, TRAVELLERS is an enchanting journey of personal discovery. A hitchhiker falls in with a group of colorful characters and the trip is intertwined with a whole second story. The film is infused with a gentle Buddhist humor and serenity. And the cinematography is truly spectacular.



Melinda and Melinda

USA, Woody Allen, 1 hr 40 min

This is a decided return to form for Woody Allen after the sub-par work of his last few films. MELINDA has the snap and crackle of the old Woody - an inventive, well-written comedy with an excellent cast. The movie takes one story and goes in two different directions - one towards comedy, the other to tragedy.



The Boys and Girl from County Clare

Ireland, John Irvin, 1 hr 30 min

Two long-feuding brothers renew their rivalry in an Irish music competition. Set in Ireland in 1970, this entertaining yarn takes full advantage of its infectious Ceili music. With Colm Meany and Andrea Carr giving appealing performances, aye, 'tis worth a listen.

(If you drop us an e-mail thru the site, we will send you a weekly notice as to what's happening at the theater.) Or you can call our HOTLINE at 215-345-6789.

When will films play?

Film Booking. Films play week-to-week from Friday through Thursday. Every Monday we determine what new films will start on Friday, what current films will end on Thursday, and what current films will continue through Friday for another week. All films are subject to this week-to-week decision-making process.

When Will a Film's Run Start?

Visit our web site or call our hotline. After we decide on Monday (Tuesday at the latest) what new films will start on Friday, we immediately let you know on our web site and on our Hotline.

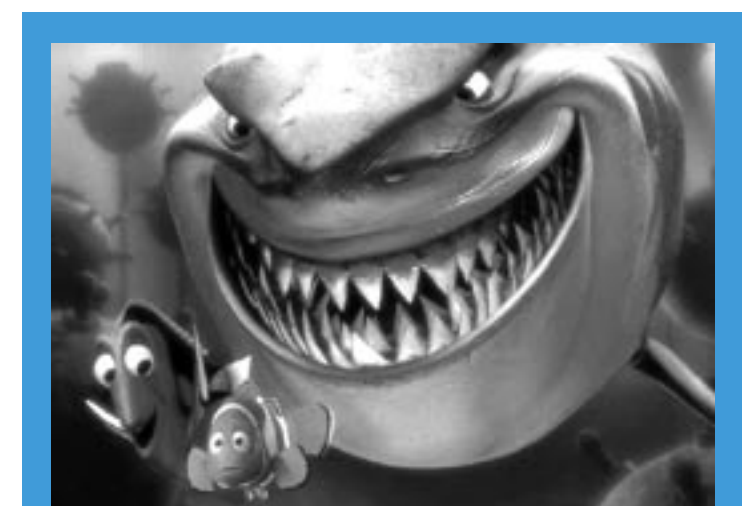
Sign up for weekly email notice. We'll send you an email message every Monday as to what is coming and going on Friday. (Sign up by emailing us at comments@countytheater.org.)

We'll call you by phone. If there is a particular film that you don't want to miss, call our box office (215/345-6789 ext. #6), and leave your name and telephone # and

the particular film that you want to see (on the answering machine is ok). We'll put that on our "Film Call List," and then we'll call you on the right Monday and tell you that your film is starting that Friday. (We have two requests regarding this service: please leave a telephone number where you have an answering machine, and please use this service just for the films you most want to see, and not for every film on the flyer.)

When Will a Film's Run End?

This is most important, since it's about grabbing that last chance to see a great film. This decision happens by the same process - we decide on Mondays which films will end on Thursday. We immediately let you know on our Web site and on our Hotline. And if you've signed up for our weekly email messages, we'll also inform you that way. (Unfortunately we don't have a phone-call system for when a film ends.)



Kids Saturday Matinees

Our Saturday Kids Matinees are up and running at the County. Classic and recent films for children and the entire family are shown every Saturday. From *Finding Nemo* to *E.T.* to *Davy Crockett*, we have some great movies. Check our separate flyer at the theater or visit our web site.
